
Veterans

ANNOUNCING THE BUS CO-OP

On October 15th, 2014, a new bus share society,

'THE BUS CO-OP' was officially launched in Langley. The founding members of the bus cooperative are: Langley Care Society, Magnolia Gardens and the Langley Senior Resources Society. It is the first bus share cooperative in North America.

The way that The Bus Co-op works is very simple: members pay a one-time membership fee, and then have access to "rent" buses for an hourly rate of \$40/hour. We will provide our own driver, and the Langley Lodge will be invoiced monthly for the hours of bus rentals used in the month. The co-op manages a small fleet of buses, and ensures maintenance, inspections and repairs are conducted to ensure the safe operation of the vehicles in the fleet. The co-op is set to expand as more members join; up to 9 members are expected to join by the end of the year.

The Bus Co-op allows Langley Lodge to retire it's older bus and eliminate the need to maintain a bus and its storage, insurance and annual licensing. It also eliminates the need for eventual capital replacement. The rental buses are all newer buses and will meet our needs for resident outings. Additional supporters of The Bus Co-op include VanCity and TransLink.

Our Director of Finance, Braydon Short, will be our representative on The Bus Co-op's Board of Directors.

We would like to recognize our President, Terry Metcalfe for his active role in the planning, development and implementation of The Bus Co-op.

Nursing Department News

The fall weather is now with us, which means a change of clothing and often a new wardrobe. Right behind this comes Christmas with new clothing and personal gifts. We would like to take this opportunity to send out a reminder of how you can work with the "team" in preventing lost clothing?

- Closet space is tight – replace summer clothing with winter but keep the choices simple in numbers. Not only is there little space but too much may be overwhelming for those residents who suffer from dementia - detrimental to their independence and ability to make choice.
- Bring all clothes (including socks, coats etc) immediately to Reception to send to laundry for labeling. Do not label yourself: our label machine is commercial and does not fade or wear off as retail products do.
- Even if you do the laundry yourself – make sure the clothing is labeled. If you wish the resident to try on their new attire first, ok - but take it right down to reception after for labeling. Label: boots, shoes, personal belongings, dentures etc
- If an article of clothing goes missing tell Reception. They would be pleased to find someone to take you to the laundry where unlabeled clothing is kept for a period of time.
- No dry cleanable items or down or feather pillows and comforters. Also no delicates like silk blouses etc. (Commercial washers and dryers are not kind to these items).
