At the meeting held on April 26th 2018, Foundation Chair Michael Brown remarked on the successes of the foundation over the past year with over \$108,000 in gifts being donated to Langley Lodge. “Fundraising for the elderly is the noble mission that our charity enthusiastically undertakes and, my thanks to all donors, volunteers, directors and staff for their efforts to inspire others about our cause”. Of particular note was the foundation’s contribution to the Eden Philosophy of Care, now implemented at Langley Lodge. “The care has always been second to none; with the Eden alternative, the environment for residents became that much better”.

Director of Fundraising Patrick Matiowski asked all donors to “please accept the gratitude of our residents – Langley Lodge is a wonderful home and this is due in no small part to the volunteers and employees that are part of the family. Anne is a very intelligent and strong woman who immigrated to Canada from Poland in 1929. She lived in a “very happy house” in Winnipeg, and has also lived in Toronto and Saskatchewan before moving to Vancouver in the late 1950’s.

In Vancouver, Anne worked as a foreman at a factory that produced high end suits and jackets—Anne was told it was “the largest factory in North America”. Because she worked with several different women named “Anne,” a friend suggested she use the nickname “Poppy,” deciding it sounded similar to her last name. The name stuck, and Anne enjoys being called “Poppy” to this day. She was in charge of three floors of the factory she worked at, and there was always lots of work to be done.
